Local Impact

For over **95 years**, YWCA Boulder County has provided a safety net to individuals and families during their time of need. Our programs at a glance:



- Over **6,000** community members served each year
- Children's Alley: The only drop-in, emergency child care center on the Front Range, providing a safe, nurturing place for children during times of crisis
 - 99% of families report that Children's Alley helps them maintain stable employment
- Latina Achievement Support: Unique mentorship program serving several area high schools to bridge the achievement gap and support teen girls in reaching their academic goals
 - In 2017, 100% of Seniors in the program went on to post-secondary education
- Reading to End Racism: An intergenerational literacy and racial equity program, serving over 3,000 children across 12 schools in Boulder County
 - Nearly half of Boulder Valley School District 7th and 8th graders report being bullied on school property. RER helps to eliminate discrimination and encourage inclusivity to bring down this number.

National Impact

YWCA is a strong, nationwide movement serving **2.2 million people** annually:

- 87% women and children, 62% at or below the federal poverty line
- 50% people of color
- We provide critical services in the areas of civil rights, economic empowerment, domestic violence/sexual assault prevention, health and wellness, and more
- We promote public policies on Capitol Hill, at the White House and with federal agencies to creating lasting change

Customize your Personal Page

Everyone who registers for Dash and Bash receives a Personal Page or webpage.
 Customize your page with a personal photo and story, manage donations, send emails and more!

• Know Your Networks

Understanding and connecting with your network can be key to your team success!
 Use the Know Your Networks worksheet to help identify people to ASK to join your team and donate. You can also log in to your Participant Center for templated solicitation emails.

Fundraise with Facebook

 Use Facebook and your social media tools to make your fundraising easier. Share your link to your personal page on your sites to give your friends, family and co-workers the opportunity to donate directly to you online.





Tips on Setting a Fundraising Goal

- ✓ Goals should be realistic, but significant.
 - If it requires hard work to attain, it will be a source of pride for your team.
- ✓ 100%
 - Make it a goal to have every team member an active fundraiser by encouraging them to make a donation or ask others to donate to their fundraising efforts.
- ✓ Kick off your fundraising by making a donation.
 - Participants who make a personal donation fundraise two times as much as those who don't.
- ✓ Arrange a goal-setting meeting with your YWCA staff support team.
 - We are here to help! Use the Goal Setting worksheet to help you through the process.
- Once reaching your goal, be sure to increase the dollar amount.
 - If donors feel they can help you attain your goal, they'll continue to give.
- ✓ Set a goal for team size as well as collective fundraising.
 - Recruiting more team members can mean a substantial increase in fundraising.
- ✓ Share your goal.
 - Use email, social media, and your team page to make your goal known to your network.
 Encourage your team members to do the same! Send thank you emails/letters to family, friends and other supporters.

It's easier than ever to raise money with our online fundraising tools.
Start by setting up your Personal Page by logging in at ywcadashbash.org.

Use your Personal Page to:

- Share your story, upload photos/videos and display your fundraising progress
- Create a custom URL to take people directly to your Personal Page
- Import contacts into your Participant Center address book
- Send emails to recruit team members and ask for donations
- Turn on your Honor Roll to acknowledge those who have contributed
- Send thank you emails/letters to friends, family and other supporters
- Participants who customize their Personal Page fundraise five times more than those who don't.







Building a Strong Team Recruiting your Dream Team

- ✓ Have a fun kick-off registration event at your office. Our YWCA staff is here to support
 you. We can get your co-workers pumped up to join the team and create impact in
 the important mission of empowering women and eliminating racism.
- ✓ Place an article in your company's office intranet or company newsletter. Include names of teammates and other contact information to let readers know who's participating and how they can join or contribute to the cause.
- ✓ Make announcements at staff meetings and have laptops ready for co-workers to sign up after the meeting.
- ✓ Utilize your social networking tools to invite friends and family to join your corporate team.
- ✓ Use your email and voicemail message to mention your team and team Web page.
- ✓ Get your company's executives on board. Support from top management is a great motivation for people to join your team. The YWCA Dash and Bash promotes company teamwork and morale by bringing employees together for a common cause.
- ✓ Create challenges and kick-off parties to increase participation and team unity.
- ✓ Have a team t-shirt design contest. Post the entries in a public place or online and let everyone vote for a winner. Inquire to see if your company would be willing to cover the cost of team shirts.
- ✓ Join the YWCA team week competitions to receive recognition and prizes for the teams that have the most registrations and closer to the event the highest fundraising. Great onsite prizes are available including a VIP breakfast for your team the morning of the event, a specially decorated tent and even a personal team port-o-let.

Being part of an important cause is great motivation. Here are some other powerful and fun ways to motivate your Dash and Bash team.

Inspire Your Team to Fundraise

Sending regular updates to your team members can help keep their fundraising on track. Share your own fundraising ideas and personal fundraising progress to help inspire them. Highlight a fundraising success story within your own team. You can also send emails from your Participant Center Team Page to easily communicate with your team at once.

Team Fundraising

Beyond the camaraderie and fun that comes from participating as a team, another benefit is that you are working together to have the greatest impact possible for women, girls and communities. Here are a few fundraising activities you can do as a team:

- Dress for Empowerment Day or jeans days at work
- Bake sale or Lemon aide "Stand against Racism" sale
- Chic garage sale or glam clothing swap fundraiser
- Women's empowerment wine event












Put the FUN in Fundraising

FAQ

How do I turn in donations?

We recommend turning in contributions right away. The faster you turn in your contributions, the faster the YWCA can begin putting those contributions to good work. You can mail your checks in to the YWCA, 2222 14th Street, Boulder, CO 80302. You can also turn in money and checks when you pick your packet up or the day of the Dash and Bash.

Who should checks be made payable to?

Please make checks payable to the YWCA. Please be sure to write the participants name and Dash and Bash on the memo line of each check.

What is a matching gift?

A matching gift is a gift from a donor's employer that matches the donor's original gift. Many employers match dollar-for-dollar. Ask your human resources staff, or visit your company's intranet for more information.

How long are the Dash and Bash routes?

There is a 5K, 10K and a one-mile kids dash option. Participants will have a timing chip if they want to challenge themselves or individuals can enjoy the event as a fun walk/run.
